Dear Ranking Member Rahall:

On behalf of the nation's leading manufacturer of ductile iron pipe and fittings, McWane, Inc., I write to commend your introduction of H.R. 3533, the *Invest in American Jobs Act of 2011*. This important legislation seeks to bring the nation's principal federal-aid clean water infrastructure program in-line with the nation's transportation infrastructure programs by granting a preference for U.S.-manufactured products in projects financed by the Clean Water State Revolving Fund.

McWane Inc., produces waterworks infrastructure products that comprise the backbone of this nation's water distribution and wastewater treatment systems. The McWane family of companies produces these vital products right here in the United States, employing thousands of U.S. workers across fourteen states, including California, New York, Texas, Ohio, Alabama, Utah, and New Jersey.

While many of our competitors have moved their foundry operations abroad at the expense of American jobs to avoid U.S. environmental and workplace health and safety standards, McWane remains committed to American industry and American workers. McWane has invested hundreds of millions of dollars to modernize its U.S. plants and make them safe, efficient, and compliant with U.S. regulations. In doing so, we have preserved thousands of well-paying American jobs and the futures of many communities.

The *Invest in American Jobs Act* is an important policy statement that U.S. taxpayer dollars should not be used to reward those companies who have moved their operations, investment dollars, and jobs to foreign countries or to foreign foundries that completely disregard environmental and worker and workplace safety regulations, and principles of fair trade. Many of those foreign plants are operated without waste, air, and water pollution control systems, increasing the level of greenhouse gases and other pollutants that ultimately affect us all. Moreover, many of these countries engage in unfair trade practices such as currency manipulation, subsidies, and unreasonable tariffs. To prevent further harm to the environment

and the loss of jobs to unfair competition, taxpayer-financed federal aid programs – particularly those administered by the federal agency charged with protecting the environment – should give a commonsense preference for American manufactured products in infrastructure projects. Such preferences ensure that companies and workers who play by the rules can compete in these taxpayer-financed procurement markets. It is simply the right thing to do.

Passing the *Invest in American Jobs Act* will ensure that this nation's infrastructure procurement policies reflect our environmental, safety, and fair trade priorities and laws. H.R. 3533 will also ensure that federal tax dollars are reinvested in American communities, creating American jobs. This is vital legislation that should be enacted now. Thank you for introducing the *Invest in American Jobs Act*.
